At least once every 10 years, city councils, town boards, and county boards throughout the region update their local comprehensive plans. A local comprehensive plan represents a community's vision of how it wants to grow and change – how it will develop its land, redevelop older areas, ensure adequate housing, provide roads and sewers, protect natural areas, and meet other community objectives.

Under State law, the Metropolitan Council reviews local comprehensive plans to ensure they're in accord with the overall framework provided by the regional plans.
