Building/Housing Rights and Transfers Workshop Monday, October 29, 2018 6:30 p.m., Eureka Town Hall

This is designed to be a free, Eureka Township-specific training seminar for Clerks, Town Board Supervisors and Planning Commissioners. It will build on important definitions to describe our zoning as it relates to housing rights, explain grandfathering rules, transferring housing rights, interaction with the Ag Preserve program, application forms and procedure, and then recommend a more disciplined approach to keeping track of transfers past and future.

The workshop will be a public meeting but is not intended to be an open house. Audience participation will be minimal. The presenter will be Jeff Otto, former Eureka Board Chair and primary author of Eureka's Transfer ordinance. It is expected to last about two hours.

- The development of permit administration, audit and tracking. (Thanks in large part to Treasurer Marcia Wilson)
- The updating of all permit application forms and progress toward the refinement of our fee's schedule. (Thanks to Bob, Ranee, Supervisors Mark Ceminsky, Butch Hanson and Planning Commission Member Al Novacek)
- Proper administration and the tracking of "Building Right Transfers". (A special meeting/class is being held by past Supervisor Jeff Otto October 29th)
- Approximately 40 RFP's (Request for Proposals) are being sent to building inspectors and firms that serve our area to find a replacement for our retiring Building Inspector.
- Much time has been invested by Bob and Ranee to bring our Website up-to-date and to make it more userfriendly and navigable.

Again, your Supervisors were elected to accomplish your agenda as residents of our Township, and we are all working hard to attain those tasks. Please stop in on a Tuesday or Thursday to meet Ranee and Bob. Also, never hesitate to connect with me, or any of your Township's Leadership Team, with suggestions or requests. We are fortunate to serve our Township and blessed to live in Eureka Township. Our promise to you is to strive for professionalism as we bring efficiencies and the required value to our Township Government.


I live in Eagan and have two grown children, Justin and Cassie.

2018 General Election Dates to Remember

- Vote by mail or in person September 21 through November 5
- **Register to vote in advance** by October 16 to save time on Election Day; must be registered at least 20 days prior to the election to appear on election roster.

• November 6, 2018 – General Election

Check your voter status - <u>https://mnvotes.sos.state.mn.us/VoterStatus.aspx</u> You must re-register if:

- You move, even just changing apartments within the same building.
- You change your name.
- You have not voted in four years.

Register to Vote in Minnesota

You can register to vote online, by mail, or in person with your local election official

OR at the polls on Election Day. Once you register, you can check your status using the state's online Voter Status search. <u>https://mnvotes.sos.state.mn.us/VoterStatus.aspx</u>

Online

You can register to vote online using the MN Secretary of State's Online Voter Registration Application. In addition to meeting the eligibility requirements listed above, you must also:

- Provide a valid e-mail address.
- Provide an identification number. This might be:
- Your MN driver's license number.
- Your MN state ID card number.
- The last 4 digits of your Social Security number.

By Mail

To register by mail, download and complete the Minnesota Voter Registration Application. <u>https://www.sos.state.mn.us/media/1587/voter-registration-application.pdf</u>

The form is designed so that when you fold it, the return address is already printed for you. NOTE: Visit the state's Voter Registration Applications section if you need another special version of the form (e.g., a large print version or one in another language).

In Person

Using the same Minnesota Voter Registration Application, you can register in person at your local county elections office OR at the polls on Election Day.

If you register on Election Day, you must have a photo ID (the ID can be expired.) and a document with current name and address.

Approved photo IDs (choose one)

- Driver's license, state ID or learner's permit issued by any state
- U.S. Passport, U.S. Military or Veteran ID
- Tribal ID with name, signature and photo
- Minnesota university, college or technical college ID
- Minnesota high school ID

Approved documents (choose one), can be shown on electronic device.

- Bill, account or start-of-service statement due or dated within 30 days of the election for:
- Phone, TV or internet, solid waste, sewer, electric, gas or water
- Banking or credit card
- Rent or mortgage, Residential lease or rent agreement valid through Election Day
- Current student fee statement





No Excuse for Trespassing

ALWAYS ask for permission before entering private land. You need permission to hunt on agricultural land even if it is not posted. Trespassing is a misdemeanor. If convicted you could lose your license to hunt. All conservation officers and peace officers enforce trespass laws.

Remember, your actions reflect on all hunters.

Hunters Enter at Own Risk . .

A landowner who allows persons onto his or her land free of charge for recreational purposes (including hunting), as defined by Minnesota Statutes chapter 604A, is generally not responsible for or liable to such persons for injuries or damages they might sustain while on the land. For complete details, please refer to Minn. Stat. Ch. 604A.20–604A.27.

TRESPASS LAW

The trespass law applies to all outdoor recreation, including: hunting, boating, fishing, trapping, hiking, and camping. When taking part in outdoor recreation, you may not enter legally posted land or agricultural land without permission.

Landowners, lessees, or authorized managers need only post their land once a year. The signs must be placed at intervals of 1,000 feet (500 feet in wooded areas) or signs may be placed at primary corners of each parcel and at access points to the property. Signs must state "No Trespassing," or similar words, in 2-inch high letters and have either the signature or the name and telephone number of the landowner, lessee, or manager.

There can be civil or criminal penalties for violation of the trespass laws with maximum fines up to \$3,000 and license revocation. All conservation officers and peace officers enforce trespass laws.

Public Comments Part of the Meeting Minutes?



As of the October 9, 2018 Town Board meeting, if speakers desire their public comments at any meeting to be part of the meeting minutes (the official record), written copies of those comments must be submitted to the Clerk or Deputy Clerk at the time the comments are made.

This includes regular meetings in which a three minute per person comment period, not to exceed 20 minutes for all comments, is reserved, and for any Special Meeting, Public Hearing, etc.

Possible Road Swap Update



Last winter, Dakota County approached the Township about possibly swapping "ownership" of some of the Township roads with the County. An announcement of this possibility was made at the 2018 Annual Meeting in March. The Township then received a petition from residents on Highview Ave., north of 250th St., requesting to be converted to a County road. This petition was forwarded to the County and they have responded that they will not consider this request, primarily because it does not benefit more than one community. Discussions continue looking at possibly 240th or 225th streets. If any roads are turned over to Dakota County, they will be upgraded to a 110 foot right-of-way and paved.

Work Group to Study Possible Commercial/Industrial Zone in Eureka

Two Board Supervisors (Butch Hansen and Mark Ceminsky) and two Planning Commissioners (Ralph Fredlund and Allen Novacek) will be holding regular meetings in the next month or two to explore possible options to create an area or areas of the Township to consider rezoning as Commercial and/or Light Industrial. This work group will then work with the Township lawyer, professional services planner, and hold public hearings prior to making any recommendations to the Town Board. Please check the posting board on the south end (parking lot side) of the Town Hall for meeting times and dates. The public is welcome to observe, but participation is very limited during this phase of the process.



If you are in doubt about whether a project requires a permit, please contact the Town Hall at 952-469-3736 or clerk@eurekatownship-mn.us.

PLEASE NOTE – As of January 26, 2017, the Vermillion River Watershed Joint Powers Organization is again overseeing parts of the permitting process for anyone who lives in the Vermillion River Watershed (northern 2/3 of Eureka Township). 

Got a Project in Mind?

A reminder that Eureka Township governmental actions take place on a **monthly basis**, not a business day model. If you are planning a project that may require a building permit, please plan ahead and allow ample time, especially if you have a specific deadline in mind. *When filling out applications, be sure they are completed in full, with all requested information provided, and submitted to the Town Hall 10 days prior to meetings*. Double check the application instruction sheets and check the website!
