Budget for 2014

The Clerk presented a Budget Worksheet for 2014.

Money is levied for each fund: Road and Bridge, General Fund, and Miscellaneous (Town Hall Fund). Any surplus funds for the year stay in each fund, unless the Town Board passes a motion by unanimous vote to move funds to another account.

The Town Board reviewed the 2014 Budget and placed dollar amounts into the expense columns of the Budget. The Town Board then reviewed the income portion of the Budget. Dollar amounts were placed in the Budget according to projected income.

Total projected expense for the year was \$562,350. Total projected revenues for the year was \$81,700. The Total amount of Levy being requested at the March 12, 2013 Annual Meeting will be \$480,650. See attached Budget Worksheet for further breakdown proposal.
