

EUREKA TOWN BOARD MINUTES FOR JANUARY 11, 1993

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY CHAIRPERSON SCHINDLEDECKER. PRESENT WERE SUPERVISORS JOHNSON, KADLEC AND TOPP, CLERK LEINE AND TREASURE SCHULZ.

JOHNSON MOVED TO ACCEPT THE DECEMBER MINUTES WITH THE FOLLOWING CORRECTIONS: PAGE 1, PARAGRAPH 2: CHANGE "WORKING" TO "WORDING". PAGE 1, PARAGRAPH 5: CORRECT SPELLING OF S.O.A.R. REPRESENTATIVE NAME IS "WUSTENBERG". AND CHANGE "AREA" TO "ACRE". PAGE 1, PARAGRAPH 7: CORRECT SPELLING OF "EUGENE MALECHA". KADLEC SECONDED THIS MOTION AND MOTION CARRIED.

KADLEC MOVED TO ACCEPT THE TREASURES REPORT AS READ, SECONDED BY JOHNSON AND CARRIED.

KADLEC MOVED TO PAY THE BILLS PRESENTED BY CLERK LEINE, SECONDED BY JOHNSON AND CARRIED.

MILLER CONSTRUCTON INFORMED THE BOARD THAT THE TOWNSHIP WAS MAINTAINING 2250 FEET OF JAMICA AVE. FROM COUNTY ROAD 86 NORTH.

THE JANUARY 8, 1993 MEETING WITH ATTY KUNTZ BROUGHT FORWARD THE FOLLOWING MINNESOTA STATE STATUTE. 160.05 DEDICATION OF ROADS.

SUBDIVISION 1: SIX YEARS. WHEN ANY ROAD OR PORTION OF A ROAD HAS BEEN USED AND KEPT IN REPAIR AND WORKED FOR AT LEAST SIX (6) YEARS CONTINUOUSLY AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY BY A ROAD AUTHORITY, IT SHALL BE DEEMED DEDICATED TO THE PUBLIC TO THE WIDTH OF THE ACTUAL USE AND BE AND REMAIN, UNTIL LAWFULLY VACATED, A PUBLIC HIGHWAY WHETHER IT HAS EVER BEEN ESTABLISHED AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY OR NOT. NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL IMPAIR THE RIGHT, TITLE, OR INTEREST OF THE WATER DEPARTMENT OF ANY CITY OF THE FIRST CLASS SECURED UNDER SPECIAL LAWS 1885, CHAPTER 110. THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL APPLY TO ROADS AND STREETS EXCEPT PLATTED STREETS WITHIN CITIES.

THE TOWNBOARD STATED THAT BECAUSE OF THIS STATUTE, JAMICA AVE WAS A PUBLIC ROAD AT ITS PRESENT WIDTH AND MAINTAINED LENGTH, NO LESS AND NO MORE.

JOHNSON MOVED TO ACCEPT THE LGU UNDER THE WCA TO ADMINISTER WET LAND IN THE TWP, SECONDED BY TOPP AND CARRIED.

BOARD ASKED CHAIR TO OBTAIN A WET LANDS MAP OF THE TWP. TOPP MOVED TO ADJOURN, SECONDED BY KADLEC AND CARRIED.
