## Election Day

Is on November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024

\*Town Hall will be closed for regular business.

### WHO CAN VOTE?

To vote in Minnesota, you must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old on Election Day, and a resident of Minnesota for at least 20 days.

If you had a felony conviction, you can vote if you are not currently incarcerated for the felony offense. You can vote while under guardianship, unless a judge has revoked your right to vote.

#### **REGISTER TO VOTE**

You must be registered to vote at your current address. To register or to update your registration, go to <a href="https://www.sos.mn.gov/elections-voting/register-to-vote/">https://www.sos.mn.gov/elections-voting/register-to-vote/</a>

You can also register at your polling place on Election Day. You must show proof of your name and current address. For further details regarding this process and other valuable voting information, visit mnvotes.gov or call 1-877-600-VOTE (8683)

FACT: Minnesota's Voter Registration Database is continuously updated through a rigorous maintenance and data-matching process.

## Reminder of a few Rules and Regulations:



## Hunting

\*ALWAYS ask for permission before entering private land. You do need permission to hunt on agricultural land even if it is not posted.

Trespassing is a misdemeanor. If convicted, you could lose your license to hunt. All conservation officers and peace officers enforce trespass laws.

\*A landowner who allows persons onto his or her land free of charge for recreational purposes (including hunting), as defined by Minnesota Statutes chapter 604A, is generally not responsible for or liable to such persons for injuries or damages they might sustain while on the land. For complete details, please refer to Minn. Stat. Ch. 604A.20–604A.27.



## **Snow Removal**

\*Snow from your property should be plowed and stored on your own property and not pushed across roads.

\*It is unlawful to dump snow from your private driveway onto the road, according to Minnesota Statute 160.2715 subd. (a)(1). Under civil law, any person dumping snow on the road is liable for any accident that it caused.


